Collaborative Assessment

- 1. What and Who is important to the client.
- 2. Use this information to engage with the client.
- 3. What the client might want.
- 4. Is the client <u>able</u> and <u>willing</u> to do what it takes?
- 5. Negotiate small, simple, easy steps that client knows how to do.
- 6. The client actually carries out according to his/her plan.
- 7. Review and reassess what is the next small step.
- 8. This gets repeated until the client reasons the level where it is "better enough" to stop.
- 9. All the credit for successes goes to the client.
